

Discover China and Its Opportunities

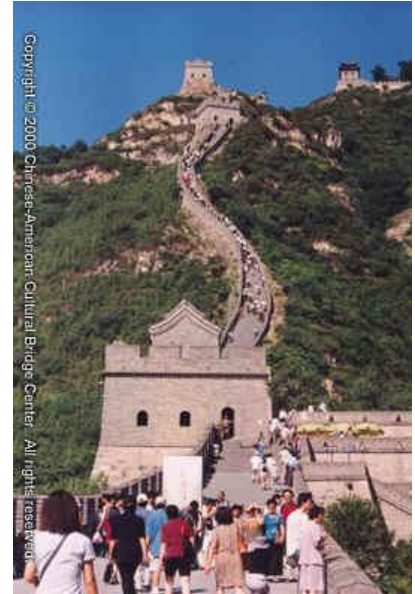
10 days to: Beijing, Su Zhou, Hang Zhou and Shanghai

Tentative Travel Dates: July 15 – July 26, 2010

Day 1: International flight from U.S. to Beijing.

Day 2: Arrive in Beijing. Check-in at hotel, and enjoy the Welcome Banquet (Beijing Duck Dinner) hosted by CACBC China Office, Cultural Exchange Bureau, and the China Travel Service.

Day 3: Explore the Great Wall of China - one of the seven wonders of the ancient world! In the afternoon, visit the magnificent Temple of Heaven, the largest temple and altar complex in China, where the Emperors of the Ming and Qing Dynasty worshipped Heaven and prayed for good harvests.



Day 4: A city tour of Beijing to the center of the city - Tianan-Men Square - the largest open plaza in the world - accommodating half a million people at one time. Explore the Forbidden City (Palace Museum), the former Imperial Palace for the 24 Emperors of the Ming and Qing Dynasties with 9,999 rooms inside the palace.

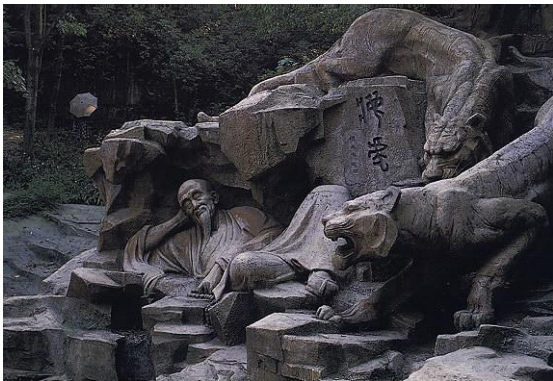
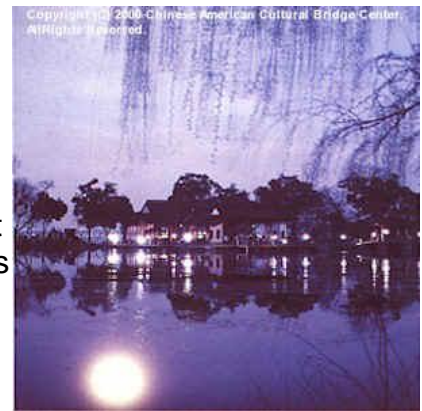


Day 5: Visit the 800 year-old Summer Palace with the largest garden in China. Here, the royal family of the Qing dynasty came to spend relaxing summers and handle government affairs. Have a look at the 2008 Olympic Village. (Flight or Night Sleeper Train to Hangzhou).



Day 6: Visit West Lake, one of China's best-loved scenic attractions. This 5.6 sq. km lake is not only breathtakingly beautiful, but is also the source of some of China's most famous fairy tales. In the afternoon, see the famous Three Pools Mirroring the Moon on the outer banks of West Lake. It is called this because pagodas rise from the water of three separate ponds, and an illusion of three moons is reflected on the surface of the water.

Also visit Hu Pao Spring, where China's famous Long Jing Tea is at its best - brewed with the famous Hu Pao spring water. Ancient tradition states that in this spring, the lives of humans and animals co-exist in great harmony.



Day 7: In the morning, visit Hangzhou's new economic develop zone, meet with Hangzhou business owners or visit a Chinese electronic acupuncture and acupressure factory to see how Chinese house hood used these for simple healing. In the afternoon, bus to SuZhou. Explore Suzhou - a historical city famous for its gardens and embroideries. Start your journey in Suzhou at Tiger Hill (Hu Qiu). Regarded as "The First Scenic Spot in Wuzhong," it is the most famous sight in Suzhou. There are old trees and cultural relics everywhere - such as the Sword Testing Stone, the Sword Pond, and the Yunyan Pagoda.

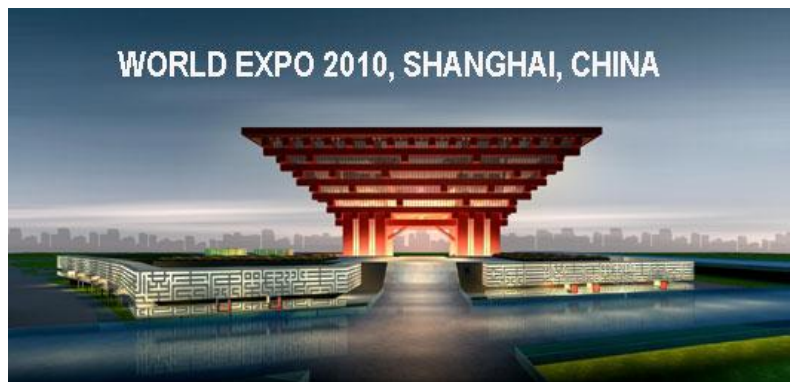
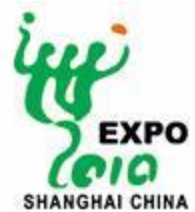


Day 8: In the afternoon, visit the Suzhou Silk Mill. See how silk is extracted from silk worms, and turned into fine materials, possibly watch a fashion show. In the afternoon, bus to Shanghai, a modern bustling metropolis of thirteen million people in the southeast region. China's center for industry and commerce, Shanghai, is also called the "Paris of the East," because for many years the city was home to large numbers of Europeans, giving it an international flavor. Visit City God's Temple (Cheng Huang Miao).

This used to be the temple to a local deity, which the inhabitants believed would protect them in every city. The city deities were frequently real persons to whom the town owed something. Today, the temple is home to arts and craft stores.

Day 9: Free Time

(Free Time indicates no activity, you can choose to do personal business or you can choose to go with our tour guide and visit the 2010 World Expo at your own expense. The World Expositions have attained increasing prominence as grand events for economic, scientific, technological and cultural exchanges, serving as an important platform for displaying historical, experience, exchanging innovative ideas, demonstrating esprit de corps and looking to the future. Being the first World Exposition on the theme of city, Exposition 2010 will attract governments and people from across the world, focusing on the theme "Better City, Better Life." the full potential of urban life in the 21st century and a significant period in urban evolution.)
